OUR ORIGINS History

Organised in 1915, the North New Zealand Conference (NNZC) acts as the central operational hub of the global Seventh-day Adventist Church serving and impacting the North Island of New Zealand. The Church wants all New Zealanders in the North Island of New Zealand to have an opportunity to consider the Gospel Message and its call and impact on their lives. The Church also wants to make people's lives a little better as we engage with the community around us. The NNZC exists to provide services and programmes to individual churches in the North Island of New Zealand that allow them to work in their local communities seeking to bring people together and support well-being and wholeness of life.

Governance is by way of a quadrennially appointed committee which is a blend of employed staff and volunteers.

Operationally the churches work with volunteers who are members or regular attendees. They are supported by the NNZC that employs pastors to provide leadership and spiritual guidance to the churches and also administrative staff in a central office to care for the business and business operations of the Church.

OUR PURPOSE

The purpose of the NNZC and any affiliated entity or entities of the NNZC is to make disciples of Jesus Christ who live as His loving witnesses and proclaim to all people the everlasting Gospel of the Three Angels Messages in preparation for His soon return.

OUR VISION

The vision of the Seventh-day Adventist church in the North Island, New Zealand is summarised in three words; Connect, Grow, Multiply. These words have a spiritual foundation with practical outcomes. Outcomes that help both church members and the community we serve.

Connect. We first invite people to connect with God through regular worship gatherings and on a personal level. Secondly, as people gather, they connect and support each other. Thirdly, our vision is to connect with the community in ways that add value to others and where possible, alleviate suffering. One of the ways the Bible describes church, is like a body. "If one part (of the body) suffers, every part suffers with it" 1 Corinthians 12:26.

For example, following the devastation of cyclone Gabrielle, and other floods across New Zealand, church members teamed up to help the community with the clean-up. ADRA, (Adventist Development Relief Agency) is the arm of the church that coordinates these opportunities.

Grow. It is our purpose to see believers grow in Christian maturity which will have a positive impact on their lives and in turn the community. The SDA church has a structured approach to this growth through the weekly Sabbath School for all ages. Many congregations also have Club Ministries for ages 5-16.

Multiply. The flow on effect of Connect and Grow, is Multiply. It is our aim to see more lives transformed into followers of Jesus and therefore live a purpose filled life, and in turn have a positive impact on society.

As Lead Pastor in the North Island, I am proud of how the Seventh-day Adventist Church is proactive in all these areas.

Coming back into active community after the Covid lockdowns of the previous years has been a real highlight for our church communities. We have seen new people engaging with a church, enjoying the opportunity to meet and connect with people regularly who appreciate the sermons and programmes that give hope and support. One of the great benefits for the elderly and homebound has been the online options now available for joining worship that developed over the Covid era. We offer weekly, over 11 online options for worship including languages such as Tongan and Chinese.





YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

Ministries aimed at youth 16 – 30 year-olds, provide for young people to come together and engage in spiritual activities, social interaction and physical sports activities.

Spiritual Development included 5 programmes involving 145 people.

Sports included 4 tournaments involving 1,871 people.



Adsafe

Improving our ability to create a safe community is incredibly important to the Church. Over the last year, training for members, to ensure we operate in a safe manner, saw over 200 people trained by ADSAFE, the Church's Child and Vulnerable Elderly/Adults protection office.

EDUCATIONAL IMPACT

Providing educational opportunities continues to be part of our service to the community. We continued to invest in and encourage church programmes that grow people holistically, develop resilience and encourage joy in life and community.

ADVENTIST EDUCATION - SCHOOL SYSTEM

Student Enrolment 1,412

Operating 13 schools across the North Island allows families to access a values-based quality education for their children. While the New Zealand Curriculum is taught in the school, the programme also emphasizes strong Christian values and provides for emotional and social well-being and spiritual growth.

In the 2022/2023 year, 1,412 students accessed Adventist education. Numbers of students accessing Adventist education are holding steady as families have dealt with the return to school after the Covid era.

ENHANCING COMMUNITY HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Seventh-day Adventists are known for their emphasis on health, and the North New Zealand Conference values the opportunity to contribute to the well-being of members and the wider community. Trained church members and community professionals offer a range of health-related programmes for the community including ELIA (Empower-Lifestyle-Innovate-Advocates) wellness programmes. Among these in 2022/2023 were the CHIP (Coronary Health Improvement Programme), DARP (Depression and Anxiety Recovery Programme), Forgive to Live and Retirement Ready. Other service projects that engage with the community are part of a partnership the North New Zealand Conference has with ADRA (Adventist Development and Relief Agency) known as CTP (Community Transformational Partnership).

People who attended these programmes have found real benefits that are improving their way of life and supporting a better future.

One participant of the Retirement Ready programme said, "I thought I had planned well for my retirement, but after this programme, I can see there is more I can do now to really make my retirement years so much better. Everyone should do this programme a couple of times from about 30 years of age onwards." Another said, "I wish I had learnt these things at the start of my working life, however, it is never too late to start".

BIBLE STUDY CLASSES SABBATH SCHOOL

Weekly involvement exceeds 1,105.

Other programmes offered to support learning and personal development include Bible study, understanding life and its challenges, health and wellbeing, and caring and nurturing. This is accomplished primarily through Bible Study classes and groups which also provide for language, cultural and agesupporting maximum engagement.

The weekly average reported engagement is 1,105 participants. Many more are involved but are not reported centrally. Each week members and guests gather in small groups to study prepared Bible study guides or to discuss reading and passages from the Bible. Aimed at enriching knowledge of the Bible and seeking to apply the principles and life lessons of the Bible is the aim of this hour-long programme.

We continue to access quality resources in three languages for these studies which are provided by the Adventist Book Centre and form part of its business operations.

HOPE CHANNEL OPTIONS

Hope Channel New Zealand which is partly funded by North New Zealand Conference, provides resources into the community, for those looking for spiritual and wellbeing resources. Regular requests and contact continues to be part of our support for this venture nationwide. However, there does seem to have been a decline in some areas, possibly as people have returned to a more normal pattern of life.

A regular prayer request list is sent out monthly to 'prayer warriors' with 20-30 requests from those who made contact and sent in their requests.

One person who receives the list states, "These people have reached out for help, I count it a privilege to pray for them." Other offers fulfilled nationwide are outlined below. The offers are also followed up to ensure that people receive what they requested and if they want to engage further or not.
