Looking at these numbers in comparison to 2021, Pathfinders have fallen in number by 10, but risen in staff number, this is due to a larger number doing Master Guides and staying on as Junior Counsellors.

The final total of Adventurers is the same as 2021, but with a rise in the number of Adventurers registered and a drop in the number of staff by 6.

Throughout the Conference we have a dedicated team of Pathfinder and Adventurer Leaders, the local churches in most are very supportive of the Pathfinder/Adventurer Ministries that are operating in their churches.

In comparison between the two Ministries Adventurers has grown significantly in the Conference over the past few years

This year the new Adventurer curriculum has been introduced to our clubs and it is working well, Leaders are enjoying the new colourful workbooks. The new curriculum has been written by the General Conference and adapted by the South Pacific Division to fit our needs.

A new workbook has been redesigned and updated for the Pathfinder card program this year, it has been a long time in coming, and our club who do this program will commence using the workbooks in 2023.

### PLA & MG's

We have 36 working through their Master Guide requirements this year, 10 will be invested this year. The set course takes up to 2 years to complete, working though reading and written assignments, achieving goals set by themselves and the club director, and attending 2 training sessions set by the SNZ Pathfinder Department.



This year Master Guides worldwide are celebrating 100yrs.

For the PLA course we have 11 doing the course and 4 to be invested this year. The requirements require participants to attend sessions set by the SNZ Pathfinder Department, where the MG's work can be done mainly by the individual in their own time, the PLA course is taught by the District Directors and participants are assessed on their knowledge and understanding of a set topic. Topics range from outdoor skills to leadership for running a club.

It is a massive achievement on the participants behave and are to be congratulated in be invested. These are the top awards in Pathfindering Leadership.

# Training

We hold one training session for all Pathfinder Staff to attend, this is set at the beginning of each year. In this training we cover

- Health and Safety •
- Risk Analysis Management Systems (RAMS)
- AdSafe and Code of Conduct requirements
- **Police Vetted** •

It is about bringing awareness to our Leaders and those looking after our children. This training is compulsory for staff to attend.

There is a session held for clubs in the Christchurch region and Edwina travels to Invercargill for training of the Southern Clubs. This year training was held at Pascoe Park for Pathfinders.

Training is also held for the Adventurer Leaders and staff, this year due to Covid the training was done on Zoom. This achieved its purpose, but not ideal.

It is also a great time for the staff to meet their District Director, new staff to receive extra training, and to share any concerns they may have. It is also good to meet and chat with other club staff, especially those who have been in leadership for some years, as they can share their highs and lows of running a club.
