Workplace Evangelism (Theology of Work)

Speaker: Elizabeth Ostring

“Six days shall you labour and do all your work . . .” Ex 20:8-11

The work we do for six days a week is our greatest witnessing opportunity, and an integral part of the Fourth Commandment.

“By the end of this session, participants will realize that we work not to achieve, make something happen for God, or earn a ‘living’, but through the power of the Holy Spirit we are called to bless others.”

Opening

“The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results.” Adventists have not developed a theology of work, current “Christian” theologies of work are not biblical, and yet a fundamental Adventist belief is in the importance of the fourth commandment. A biblical approach to work revitalizes outreach.

Key Point 1 (Session 1)

Separating the “spiritual” from ordinary everyday work has robbed church members of their outreach potential. Although Genesis clearly presents that human work was cursed, we need to understand why.

Bible text: Whether therefore you eat or drink or whatsoever you do, do all to the glory of God, 1 Cor 10:31.

Key Point 2 (Session 2)

“The greatest argument in favour of the gospel is a loving and lovable Christian” MH p470.

Work and outreach is relational. It is through our ordinary work that we are given opportunities to witness. But this means much depends on whether we are truly transformed, lovable Christians.

Bible text: God Called Abraham and his family to “Be a Blessing” Gen 12:1-3. Isaac is presented as an interesting example of outreach potential through ordinary work.

Key Point 3 (Session 3)

God is the Great Worker. As long as we see ourselves as the great performers we will fail (remember Abraham and Hagar). If we give everything to God, He blesses abundantly.

Bible text: “God sent me before you to preserve life...God sent me before you to preserve a posterity...God...has made me a father to Pharaoh... God has made me lord over all Egypt.” (Gen 45:5-9).

Discussion/Activity

What has been your attitude to ordinary everyday work and those who do this? How does the church foster the idea of “holy” work performed as witnessing, and less important work that does not have eternal witnessing value?

How can pastors and church leaders assist members in realizing their individual outreach potential in their everyday workplaces?

Next Steps

Pray that God will give church leaders wisdom to value all workers and their outreach potential, and to individually encourage members.

Talk to church members about their work, discover what they do and how they can use this to reach out and bless others.

Final Takeaway

The one thing I want participants to remember is that we are witnessing whether we realize it or not. Because we fail to recognize that our greatest witness is our own transformed lives, six days in our work, and on the seventh worshipping God, we make witnessing an unfortunate add on to an already exhausting life.

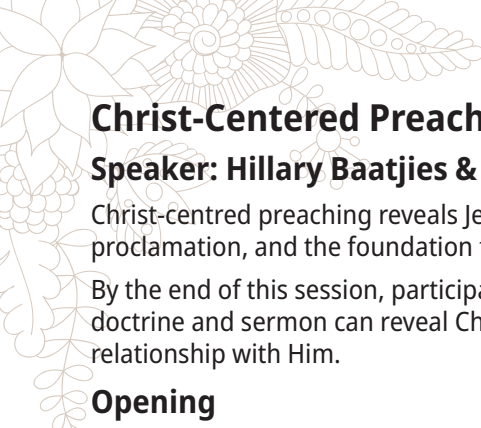

Christ-Centered Preaching

Speaker: Hillary Baatjies & Jozaine Josephs

Christ-centred preaching reveals Jesus as the centre of Scripture, the power of proclamation, and the foundation for lasting Adventist discipleship.

By the end of this session, participants will be able to identify how every biblical doctrine and sermon can reveal Christ more clearly and call people into a deeper relationship with Him.

Opening

What happens when people join the church, learn its teachings, and participate in its programmes—but do not become deeply attached to Jesus Christ?

The Adventist Church continues to grow globally, yet many who have joined have later left. This is not merely a statistical issue; it is a pastoral, discipleship, theological, and preaching issue. The central question is not simply, “How can we baptise more people?” but, “How can we preach so that people enter a living, enduring relationship with Christ?”

Invite participants to write one word that describes what makes a disciple remain faithful through disappointment, doubt, conflict, or change.

Key Point 1

Christ is the centre of Scripture

Jesus said, “These are they which testify of Me” (John 5:39). It is possible to study and preach the Bible while failing to bring people to Jesus. We may preach doctrine without revealing Christ, explain prophecy without exalting Christ, defend the Sabbath without leading people to the Lord of the Sabbath, or teach the sanctuary without introducing the great High Priest.

From Genesis to Revelation, Scripture bears witness to Christ. He is the promised Seed, the Passover Lamb, the Rock in the wilderness, the Son of Man, the Suffering Servant, the incarnate Word, the risen Lord, our righteousness, the Lamb on the throne, and the coming King.

The Scriptures testify of _____.

Key Point 2

Christ is the power of preaching.

Jesus declared, “And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself” (John 12:32). The power of preaching does not ultimately lie in the charisma of the preacher, the quality of the programme, or the sophistication of a method. Christ is the attraction and Christ is the power.

Planning, excellence, creativity, and evangelistic methods matter. But they remain servants of the message. The preacher is the messenger; Christ is the message. The church is the witness; Christ is the attraction.

Lift Me up—and I will _____ all people to Myself.

Key Point 3

Christ-centred preaching strengthens Adventist identity.

Christ-centred preaching does not weaken distinctive Adventist teaching; it gives every doctrine its proper centre. The Sabbath points to Christ the Creator and Redeemer. The sanctuary reveals Christ as sacrifice, priest, mediator, and advocate. The law reflects Christ’s character. The judgment vindicates Christ’s righteousness. The three angels proclaim the everlasting gospel of Christ. The Second Coming directs our hope toward the return of Christ.

Adventism is not a collection of doctrines placed beside Jesus. It is a biblical vision of Jesus—His creation, incarnation, atoning sacrifice, heavenly ministry, judgment, mission, and return.

3. Apply Christ: How does the listener trust, abide in, or walk with Jesus?
4. Invite a response to Christ: What response will the sermon invite?
