

North New Zealand Conference Ladder Safety Guidelines



- This is a Quick Reference Pocket Card (Reference OSHA 1910.25, 1910.26 & 1910.27 and HSE PROCEDURE HSEP 18.3, 13.8 for additional in-depth information on ladder safety)
- Inspect ladder prior to use:
- Check for missing cleats, cracked or missing rungs, damaged or missing side rails, and an adequate load rating.
- · Ladder shall not be painted.
- Ladder shall be free of grease, oil, mud or other hazards
- Keep ladder clear of doors which may be opened to ladder. If not possible, the door shall be locked or quarded.
- Check shoes for grease, mud, or a lack of traction.
- Top of ladder shall be tied off to something substantial (no handrails). The bottom of ladder shall be equipped with safety (non-skid) feet.
- Safe ladder angle shall be 4V:1H. (See reverse.)
- · Do not use any ladder which is defective.
- Top of ladder shall extend 3'-0" beyond the upper transfer point or platform.
- Extension ladder must be overlapped 3-rungs minimum.
- · A safety rail shall be provided at top of ladder platform.



LADDER RULES

- ALWAYS FACE LADDER WHEN ASCENDING OR DESCENDING.
- USE AT LEAST ONE HAND TO GRASP LADDER.
- TOP OF LADDER SHOULD NEVER BE USED AS A STEP.
- LADDERS SHOULD NEVER
- BE MOVED, SHIFTED OR EXTENDED WHILE OCCUPIED.
 - **NEVER CARRY AN OBJECT**
- OR LOAD THAT COULD CAUSE YOU TO LOSE YOUR BALANCE
